

ANTI-IMPERIALIST MOVEMENT HUGE

Meet Held to Mobilize for World Congress

A conference of representatives of Latin-American organizations opposed to imperialism was held yesterday afternoon at Lexington Hall, 109 East 116th St.

The purpose as expressed by Julio Martinez, chairman of the gathering, was to "prepare for the mobilization of the greatest possible number of organizations and individuals for participation in the anti-imperialist movement, and particularly in the Anti-Imperialist Conference to be held June 15th in New York, at Irving Plaza. This June 15th Conference will send delegates to take part in the Second Anti-Imperialist World Congress at Paris July 20th to 31st. It will also take steps to cement the alliance between the various organizations in the United States which are fighting the aggression of Wall St. and Washington in Latin America and in every corner of the world, with the organizations of the oppressed peoples in those colonial and semi-colonial lands."

Louis Gibarti international representative of the League Against Imperialism and for Colonial Independence, declared that the calling for a Second Anti-Imperialist World Congress has been made necessary by far-reaching changes in the international situation, and that the "steadily increasing aggressiveness of Yankee imperialists" has created urgent tasks of major importance for all opponents of imperialism, and he emphasized the immediate need for an intensified fight and enlargement of the Anti-Imperialist League.

Other speakers were Albert Moreau, secretary of the Latin-American department of the A. A. A. I. L., Luis Martinez, delegate from the Venezuelan Revolutionary Party, and Manuel Gomez, of the executive committee of the Anti-Imperialist League. The Centro Obrero and the Sociedad Mutualista Mexicana sent delegates who participated in the discussion of the problems confronting the emancipation movement in the Latin-American countries under the political and financial domination of the United States.
