

# MASS MEETINGS FOR TOUSSAINT

## Negro, White Workers at Two Memorials

The life and work of Toussaint L'Ouverture will be commemorated by white and Negro revolutionary workers in New York City in two major mass meetings.

As a part of National Negro Week, set aside by the Communist Party, the Brownsville Branch of the American Negro Labor Congress will hold an inter-racial memorial and dance Saturday, May 18, at 8 p. m., at Brownsville Workers Center, 154 Watkins St. Besides prominent speakers there will be a gala concert and dance.

The climax of the week will be marked by the Toussaint L'Ouverture memorial mass meeting, Tuesday evening, May 21, at St. Luke's Hall, 125 W. 130th St. The speakers will be C. H. Hathaway, editor of Labor Unity; Jean G. Lamothe, general secretary of the Haitian Patriotic Union; Albert Moreau, of the Anti-Imperialist League; Williana Burroughs, of the Teachers' Union; George Pershing, of the Communist Youth League; Richard B. Moore, of the Harlem Tenants' League, and Robert Minor, acting secretary of the Communist Party. The Arthur Gaines Kentucky Choir will supply the music.
