
End the Destruction



WAR IN THE GULF

Bush says, we're fighting for democracy and a New World Order.

Bush's New World Order sounds suspiciously like the U.S.' old world order-- U.S. control of oil, U.S control of the Mideast, racism at home and abroad. People of color in the U.S. are in war every day--economic violence (joblessness and homelessness) and chemical warfare (drugs and the environment). Now, over a quarter of U.S. troops sent to fight Arab peoples are Plack, more than a tenth are Latin, and over half the women are women of color. What's new is that, in one year, we've gone from Panama to Iraq. The new order uses military might to compensate for economic and political strength lost to Japan and Germany and to assert ever tighter control over third world peoples.










Baker says Hussein is a madman and a Hitler who must be stopped.


This war is not about one unstoppable tyrant. The U.S. imperialist policies in the Mideast eased Saddam Hussein's way for a generation. The U.S. has put together an unholy alliance to protect Western interest and reinforce our latest batch of petty tyrants. A U.S. "win" will leave the basic problems the same or worse--not the least, the denial of Palestinian rights.

The way to support our friends and family in the Gulf is to stop the war now. This is also the way to support the tens of thousands of families in the Mideast already suffering death and destruction. Without a strong movement against a world order built of bombs and blood, war will go on no matter how things end in Iraq.
