



This becomes doubly true in view of the usurpation by these lifetime judges of the power to cete legislation demanded by the people. The federal courts have become the strong est governmental bulwark of capitalism It is a favorite trick of the corpora doing business in the state of Kansas, for instance, to incorporate in New Jersey and thus escape service in the state courts. In our investigation we have made the discovery that nearly employes are taken into the federal ourts and under the rules adopted by these feudal tribunals no working man can secure compensation for injuries sustained in the performance of his work. The widow and orphan have no standing in a federal court. They are treated with as little consideration today as were their ancestors in the courts of the feudal barons of the middle ages. There can be no freedom in America so long as the nation permits itself to be governed by an irresponsible judiciary.

The query comes up: Where shall these disputes be decided that arise between the corporation organized in an other state and the citizens of this state? They should be settled in the state courts. With the adoption of the recall of the judiciary, the state courts would reflect more nearly the interests eral judge of the people than is possible now under present system. Ninety-nine per cent of the American people have nothing to lose by the abolition of the federal courts and it naturally follows that ninety-nine per cent of the Americans should join the APPEAL in its crusade against these mediaeval institutions.
