How can co-operative farming be made a success? Will it not turn out something like co-operative housekeep-ing? No. Co-operative housekeeping is an arrangement between a numbe of persons. Co-operative farming will be conducted by the government. Every state now has its experiment farms at which it trains experts in farming and where it analyzes soils and gives advice. Some counties are employing expert farm managers whose business it is to analyze soils, suggests crops, give ad-vice and do other work for increasing the farming output of the county. That is the beginning of co-operative farming. Co-operative farming in the ultimate will mean that the government will own vast tracts of land which will be managed by experts and farmed with the very latest machinery in the most scientific way. The operators will be paid in accordance with what they do. The idea is not to make money for the government, which is the owner, but to produce better results for those who do the work. .

Does Socialism demand that a man shall measure to certain standards to be a Socialist? If so, what are the standards? Is it enough for him to have a rugue idea of the objects of Socialism and to vote for the candidates or must he belong to the organization? 


