A still later Associated Press dispate says Secretary of State-Bryan will investi-gate the actions of Ambassador Wilson.

The Charges Confirmed.

Gilson Gardner in Denver Express. Mar. 8 Washington, March 1st.—The fall of the Madero government was decreed in the United States early last summer. was decided that his government was not strong enough to protect invest-ments in Mexico. Money support was withdrawn and secret financial aid was given those who were plotting against Mexican politics are largely shaped

by the speculative and investment in-terests held by powerful financiers in the United States and Great Britain. The Standard Oil company, the Guggen heims, and the Pierson company have, more to say about what happens in Mexico City than any people in Mexico. Acting in harmony with these interests during the last two years has been the Taft family—Henry W, Taft in New York, as attorney and representa-tive of the Pearson interests (an Eng-lish company), President Taft in the white house, acting through the state department, and Secretary Knox and George W. Wickersham, former part-ner of Henry W. Taft and a stock-holder and director in large Mexican

Secretary Knox informed Madero Septemper of the change in attitude.

The changed attitude of the United States was diplomatically conveyed to Madero on September 17th last. On that date a long communication was sent by knox to Madero, complaining in not only harsh, but insulting terms, that American interests were not being protected. An effort was made to show also that American citizens were not protected.
